

**Combined Notice of Finding of No Significant Impact and
Notice of Intent to Request a Release of Funds**

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the Town of Greeleyville.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about August 24, 2022 the Town of Greeleyville will submit a request to the SC Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division for the release of CDBG funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, to undertake a project known as Crosswalks/Landscaping Improvements CDBG #4-SP-21-003 for the purpose of upgrading the streetscape in the Town of Greeleyville downtown commercial area. The streetscape improvements include five (5) crosswalks and sixteen (16) oak tree islands/street trees with planting beds, stamped concrete and detectable warnings. The total cost for this project is \$223,000 with CDBG funds totaling \$198,000.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The Town of Greeleyville has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at Town of Greeleyville, PO Box 213, Greeleyville, SC 29056 and Waccamaw Regional Council of Governments, 1230 Highmarket Street, Georgetown, SC 29440 and may be examined or copied weekdays 9:00 A.M to 5:00 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to Jesse Parker, Mayor, Town of Greeleyville. All comments received by August 23, 2022 will be considered by the Town of Greeleyville prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The Town of Greeleyville certifies to SC Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division that, Jesse Parker in his capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The SC Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the Town of Greeleyville to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

The SC Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division will accept objections to its release of funds and the Town of Greeleyville's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the Town of Greeleyville; (b) Town of Greeleyville has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to SC Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division at 1201 Main Street, Suite 1600, Columbia, SC, 29201. Potential objectors should contact SC Department of Commerce/Grants Administration Division to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
